Unfortunately he contracted pneumonia and died in January 1938. Ebba had just turned 12.


Ruth Alexandria (Johnson) Kelley

Age 13 through 19


Ebba was the youngest of 3. Ruth and John had Dorothy Mae on March 10,1911 and Gilbert A Kelley on March 26, 1916.

After Ebba's mother Ruth passed, Ebba continued to live with her grandparents, Nils and Hilma Johnson in their Getty Ave. home. Hilma passed away 12/2/1944 when Ebba was 19. Her grandfather Nils health was getting worse so her brother Gilbert, his wife Niesje and their daughters Louise and Patty moved in to care for Nils until his death. Ebba moved in with her sister Dorothy at that time. Ebba lived with Dorothy and her husband Hilton until she married her husband. Gilbert and family continued to live in that home until their passing. Gilbert passed 3/13/1994 and Niesje passed 7/18/1999.

Ebba loved family and the many friends she met along her journey. Christmas time was her favorite. She asked that we bring flowers each Christmas to her gravesite.



In 1999 Charlie's health was starting to decline so they sold the Southcove home and moved into a retirement community in Woodinville called Britney Park. They realized that they were still too young for that environment. So in mid 2000 they moved to the cabin.





The cabin turned out to be too small for full time living so they had a house built on Duck Lake. The house was done August 31, 2002, the day Charlie passed away. Ebba moved in and lived there until 2009. She then moved to the Chateau in Renton, WA.

Ebba was also a friend of the Library and member of the Women Helping Women group, Friends of the Clinic and volunteered at many of the events at the Convention center. They loved living in Ocean Shores and all the friends they made.

In closing, we found this writing in Ebba's bible and find it to be a fitting thought:

"And the mother said. 'I have reached the end of my journey and I know that the end is better than the beginning, for my children can walk alone and their children after them.' And the children said, 'You will always walk with us mother, even when you have gone through the gates.' And they stood and watched her as she went on alone, and the gates closed after her. And they said, 'we cannot see her, but she is with us still. A mother like ours is more than a more than a memory. She is a living presence.'"
